- a. Public Comments – No Public Comments

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- a. 2016 Teamster Collective Bargaining Agreement - President Becker noted the wording revision suggestion from Solicitor Armstrong was put in the Bargaining Agreement and the union had a small change that was all agreed on. President Becker noted all the revisions to the Agreement.

Council Member Schleicher made a motion to approve the Teamster's Collective Bargaining Agreement dated January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2018, second by Council Member Akinjiola. Motion carried: 6 ayes

Council commented Solicitor Armstrong sent an email that a MOU should be created between the Borough and the Teamster Union on the contracted outsource work for street sweeping and cleaning.

- b. Macungie Police Department Body Camera Policy - President Becker remarked Chief Harry purchased 3 body cameras and has created a Standard Operating Procedure for the use of the body cameras. President Becker remarked that the body cameras have been funded by donations to the police department.

Chief Harry remarked he purchased the body cameras because his police officers approached him to get them. He had a camera to demonstrate to Council and explained the process to back up the videos on his computer only.

Council discussed some comments that President Becker had about the policy but no changes were made to the policy. Mayor Cordner noted the policy Chief Harry handed out before the meeting revised the last section for Data Management based on the state law regulations.

This will be tabled for approval until the January 4th meeting. Chief Harry commented that he had training today and the cameras have been put into service today under the policy regulations.

c. Delivery of Packets – Council Member Cope commented about the manner in which the Council packets are delivered. Chief Harry has addressed the issue and will be on top of the issue. He remarked that he has no problem with the police department delivering the packets since the police are driving around the Borough anyway.

d. Macungie Holiday – Council Member Schleicher commented that the Macungie Holiday event was a wonderful event and there were a lot of people around town. She remarked about having no traffic control for people to cross Main Street. It was noted to request the fire police for the event next year.
