BUDGET WORKSHOP

President Chris Becker called the budget workshop to order at 6:00 p.m. Present at the workshop were Council Members Akinjiola, Becker, Boyko, Schleicher and Yerman. Also present were Borough Manager Boehm and newly elected Fire Chief Chris Edwards and Assistant Fire Chief Todd Heffner. Council Members Hutchison and Moyer and Mayor Cordner were absent.

President Becker called for an executive session to discuss personnel. The workshop reconvened at 6:15 p.m. with no action.

President Becker reported he and Mayor Cordner attended the fire department meeting where Chris Edwards was appointed as fire chief. There was a lot of tension and Fire Chief Edwards will be working to build the fire department. Mike Natysyn has stated he resigned as fire chief and submitted his resignation as Deputy Emergency Management Coordinator. Fire Chief Chris Edwards and Assistant Chief Todd Heffner entered the meeting. As requested from Council Member Boyko, Fire Chief Edwards noted some of his certifications. Council and Fire Chief Edwards discussed some of the issues that affect the fire department currently. Fire Chief Edwards remarked that he has three other fire departments that will back him.

Council discussed the Borough's allocation to the Fire Department with Fire Chief Edwards and the equipment needed. Council was provided a list of funding to fire departments by their respective municipality. Council congratulated Fire Chief Edwards on his appointment.

Council moved on to the budget. Council discussed selling vehicles. Solicitor Armstrong was at the meeting to discuss the sewer rates. Council discussed when to increase the sewer rates for the I&I work that needs to be done on the sewer system. There were several factors to consider like the total project cost since the project has not been approved by DEP.

The Budget Workshop was adjourned at 7:34 p.m. The next budget meeting will be November 14th at 7:00 p.m.

President Becker noted Sergeant Kocher is comfortable in the Officer in Charge position and it is recommended not to hire a police chief for 2017. Mayor Cordner will discuss the police budget and address his questions.

1. <u>Single Family Homes with Open Space</u> – This was discussed at the beginning of the meeting. Council preferred the proposed plan with the 1.3 acres of open space.

2. <u>Request for Borough Sewer service</u> – Council Member Yerman made a motion to authorize the request for Borough Sewer Service to the Borough Engineer for review and recommendation for sewer capacity, second by Council Member Schleicher. Motion carried: 6 ayes

b. <u>Ordinance 2016-08, Real Estate Tax Certification</u> – Solicitor Armstrong described the amendment to the Real Estate Tax Certification increasing the tax certification fee from \$15 to \$20. He opened the public hearing and closed it with no comments. Council Member Boyko made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2016-08, second by Council Member Schleicher.

c. <u>Ordinance 2016-09, Dock Street one way going east between Church and Lea Streets</u> - Solicitor Armstrong noted the Ordinance makes Dock Street one way traveling from Church Street to Lea Street. Solicitor Armstrong open the public hearing. Council discussed the topic. There were several residents that contacted President Becker who were not in favor of the one way. Council Member Schleicher noted the one way was recommended by Engineer Kern and it is a safety issue.

Council Member Boyko made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2016-09, second by Council Member Akinjiola.

The motion died due to a tie vote. Mayor Cordner was not in attendance to break the tie vote. Council discussed the topic again. At the end of the discussion, no one changed their vote. Council Members discussed re-advertising the Ordinance for another vote and if Dock Street would remain one way during that time. Solicitor Armstrong will verify the Borough Code allows for the Mayor to come to the meeting tonight so Council could vote on the ordinance. This will be carried.

d. <u>Acceptance of Nathan Kilian's resignation from Macungie Police Department effective October</u> <u>24, 2016</u> – Council Member Boyko made a motion to accept the resignation of Nathan Kilian from the Macungie Police Department with regret, second by Council Member Schleicher. Motion carried: 6 ayes

Council Member Akinjiola questioned the size of the police force. Borough Manager Boehm noted they are short on part time police officers and Sergeant Kocher is interviewing for more officers.

e. <u>Authorization for Financial S&Lutions to start the Sewer I&I Capital Loan process</u> – This was to authorize Financial S&Lutions to start the process for the capital loan for the required I&I work. Council requested a proposal letter from Financial S&Lutions before moving forward. Borough Manager Boehm will get a proposal letter for the next meeting.

f. <u>Authorization to amend sewer ordinance regarding sewer rates</u> – Council discussed the amount of the loan. Borough Manager Boehm received information from Gary Pulcini for a loan of \$5,000,000 for 15 years and received a more definite project cost of \$4,288,788 from Engineer Garman.

Council Member Yerman was able to contact the Mayor and request he come to the meeting to break the tie vote on Dock Street. Mayor Cordner entered the meeting at this time.

Council discussed when to raise the sewer rates due to the capital loan. Borough Manager Boehm proposed keeping the flow rate the same for 2017 and add a line item on the utility bill that would be an amount calculated for debt service over the time of the loan.

Council Member Becker made a motion authorizing Solicitor Armstrong to prepare an ordinance amending the sewer rates effective January 1, 2107 based on the loan amounts, cost of construction and engineering costs, second by Council Member Boyko. Motion carried: 6 ayes

<u>Ordinance 2016-09</u> – Council continued the discussion of the Ordinance to make Dock Street a one-way street. Solicitor Armstrong reopened the public hearing. Mayor Cordner requested to hear Council's opinions on the topic. The public hearing was closed. Council Member Schleicher made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2016-09, second by Council Member Akinjiola.

It was a tie vote and Mayor Cordner voted to adopt Ordinance 2019-09. Motion carried 4 ayes, 3 nays.

g. <u>Authorization for Solicitor to prepare RFP for engineering services for Sewer I&I Capital Plan</u> -President Becker asked Council if they wanted to allow BIA to do the engineering and inspection for the I&I capital plan or would they want to get proposals for the engineering and inspection. There is also the question of who writes the RFP. Council discussed what work will be listed in the RFP.

Council Member Yerman made a motion to authorize Borough Manager Boehm, President Becker & Solicitor Armstrong to put a RFP together to choose a project management firm for the I&I work including engineering and design, second by Council Member Schleicher. Motion carried: 6 ayes

h. <u>Lower Macungie Township Request for Macungie Fire Police assistance</u> – Council Member Boyko made a motion to grant permission for the Macungie Fire Police to provide traffic control assistance to Lower Macungie Township on November 18-20, 2016 provided they have the manpower, second by Council Member Hutchison. Motion carried: 6 ayes

ITEMS NOT ON AGENDA

a. Council discussed a reoccurring situation of continued ambulance calls to assist a resident from the fire department and that the family should get their own assistance. Solicitor Armstrong will write a letter that will be signed from Emergency Management Coordinator Boyko.

b. <u>Sale of Police Car</u> – Council discussed the possibility of selling the police car. That will be decided during the budget workshops. Currently Mechanic Keiser is working on stripping the car. Council Member Yerman made a motion to authorize the mechanic to stop work on the Dodge car until Council has decided whether or not they are keeping the car, second by Council Member Boyko. Motion carried: 6 ayes

Hearing no further business to be brought before Borough Council, the meeting was adjourned at 10:10 pm.
