

## **Christmas Tree Collection**

CHRISTMAS TREES WILL BE PICKED UP BY THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT
ON THE FOLLOWING DAYS:

## JANUARY 13TH • JANUARY 20TH

TREES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED IF THEY ARE IN PLASTIC BAGS, BOUND WITH TWINE, AND/OR HAVE ANY ORNAMENTS ON THEM, INCLUDING LIGHTS.

IF YOUR TREE IS TALLER THAN 6 FT., PLEASE CUT IT IN HALF BUT DO NOT REMOVE THE BRANCHES FROM THE TREE.

IF YOU WISH TO REMOVE YOUR TREE EARLIER, OR LATER, IT CAN BE TAKEN TO THE EMMAUS COMPOST CENTER FOR RECYCLING.



## **FALL 2024 LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE**

The Borough has contracted for fall leaf collection in 2024. There will be no charge for the collection procedure. Leaves will be collected curbside during the following weeks:

November 11th November 18th November 25th December 2nd

- Leaves must be at the curb before 7:00 a.m. and will be picked up when the contractor passes through. The contractor will not make special trips to pick up leaves placed at the curb after they have picked up leaves in the area.
- Leaves must be raked to the edge of the road into long narrow rows not more than 18 inches into the road.
  - <u>Note:</u> For your safety and that of the public, leaf piles placed in the road beyond 18 inches from the edge of the road are a hazard to the motoring public, school buses, and emergency vehicles.
- Leaves not placed as described or leaves left around parked cars will not be removed. Do not mix tarps, dog waste, branches, twigs, rocks, shrubbery, grass clippings, or plastic bags in with leaves.
- Also, you can use your 2024 Yard Waste Pass to take leaves to the Emmaus Yard Waste Site.

With the approach of the colder weather, heating systems and fireplaces will once again be in use. The Lower Macungie Fire Department would like to offer some safety tips so you can be warm and safe in your home. There are three (3) main problems we deal with when it comes to heating systems. One problem is carbon monoxide another is heating system malfunctions and the last is exterior venting pipes that are obstructed.

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a product of combustion, a process that occurs in those homes that heat and/or cook with gas, oil, coal, or wood. Carbon monoxide is very dangerous since it is a colorless, odorless, and tasteless gas that will literally prevent oxygen from binding with cells in the human body. Some of the symptoms associated with CO poisoning are nausea, vomiting, dizziness, confusion, red skin, and being unusually tired. It is important that if you experience any of these symptoms to exit the house immediately and call 911. This is especially true if other members of the household, or your pets, are also showing symptoms of being ill.

There are, however, simple things you can do to protect yourself from CO poisoning. First is to have your heating system, fireplace, and chimney maintained and serviced as recommended by the manufacturer. Changing the filter, cleaning, and examining the chimney flue as a part of regular service intervals will decrease the chances of CO building up. A well-maintained heating system and fireplace will burn and ventilate more effectively than one that is not serviced or where the venting system is not performing adequately.

It is also important that all exhaust vent pipes are free from obstruction where they exhaust the gases on the exterior of your home. Shrubs, bushes, flowers, and snow can all restrict the exhaust from venting properly which may cause it to then begin to build up in the home itself.

Additionally, an important safety item you can use in your home are carbon monoxide detectors. It is recommended that you have at least one (1) CO detector per floor of the home and one (1) in each bedroom. These detectors are specifically designed to recognize CO and alert you of a potential problem. If you feel ill or have a CO detector alarm, call 911 immediately as we have specialized equipment that can test for CO build-up within your home.

The Lower Macungie Fire Department wants you to be safe and comfortable in your home and a little prevention can save you from a serious illness or fire in your home. 

## What is an MS4?

You may have heard the acronym MS4 mentioned in conversation but have no idea what it means. MS4 is a bit of a catchword these days. MS4 stands for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System. The MS4 is a system of conveyances, generally owned by a public entity (e.g., Borough of Macungie, PennDOT, or the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission), that discharges stormwater runoff to waters of the Commonwealth. The system is designed specifically to collect or convey stormwater, and only stormwater. Anything that enters a system that is not entirely composed of stormwater is considered an illicit discharge!

The storm sewer system is not a combined sewer system. The Borough's stormwater conveyance system, unlike the sanitary sewer system, conveys surface water runoff from rain, irrigation, and outdoor water use directly to our waters without treatment. The conveyance system includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Catch basins
- Gutters
- Sidewalks
- Detention & retention ponds
- Man-made channels
- Vegetated swales
- Curbs
- Infiltration beds
- Streets
- Ditches
- Rain gardens

In the Borough of Macungie, the stormwater conveyance system ultimately discharges to the Lehigh River, which then flows to the Delaware River. In our Borough, the MS4 is monitored for erosion, flooding, and hazardous spills to ensure the best quality runoff into our waterways. Please be mindful of what you allow to enter the storm sewer system!

## **E&S (Erosion & Sediment) CONTROL HOTLINE**

If stormwater is "cloudy" or "dirty" and originates from an area of active earth disturbance, you will receive the quickest response by contacting the Lehigh County Conservation District at 610-391-9583. The Conservation District is responsible for investigating all erosion and sediment control concerns relating to active construction sites on behalf of the Borough. Please provide your name, address, telephone number, and the specific location of the origin of the sediment-laden runoff.

## ILLICIT DISCHARGE DETECTION & ELIMINATION (IDD&E)

As per Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) regulations, Borough of Macungie is required to implement and administer a program for the detection, elimination, and prevention of illicit discharges into our regulated Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4). Examples of illicit substances include:

- Automobile oil
- Chlorinated pool water
- Construction site runoff
   Laundry wash water

Paint

- Septic system drainage
- · Grease generated by food preparation in commercial operations
- Household chemical products
- Yard waste (including grass clippings)
- Sanitary waste (among other things)

## **IDD&E HOTLINES**

If you witness a potential illicit discharge into the waters of the Commonwealth or any other event that could adversely affect water quality, we ask that you contact the Lehigh County Office of Emergency Services immediately by dialing 610-437-5252. You may also notify the Borough at 610-966-2503 and/or DEP's Bethlehem Office at 610-861-2070. Again, please be sure to reach out as soon as you witness an event. As time passes, it becomes increasingly difficult to trace the source of the event.

## PRACTICAL GUIDE TO SNOW PREPAREDNESS

The Public Works Department is dedicated to the safety of all of our residents. The process of snow removal, which varies due to the intensity of each snow event, is a challenge for all of us. In an effort to prepare our residents for impending snowstorms, we offer this guide to keep you informed as to what to expect when it snows.

### **SAFETY FIRST!**

If a weather emergency is declared it is mandatory that all vehicles be moved from the streets. This allows access to snow plowing equipment so that these roads can remain open to emergency vehicles. Any vehicles in violation of the weather emergency requirements may be subject to towing and the cost of reclamation.

### **SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES:**

- Cedar Street (north side) from Church St. to Spring St.
- Church St. (east side), from Main St. to the South Borough Line.
- Lea St. (east side), from Main St. to Cotton St.
- Locust St. (north side), from Church St. to the West Borough Line.
- Main St. (north and south side) from the Borough line to Borough Line
- Poplar St. (west side) from Main St. to Hickory St.

### **DESIGNATED PARKING AREAS:**

During a declared snow and ice emergency only, parking will be provided for residents at the following locations:

- Borough Hall Parking Lot
- Macungie Institute Parking Lot
- Flower Park Parking Lot

Plowing occurs as needed when weather conditions arise. Our priority is to keep emergency routes and roads open to allow for emergency vehicles and school buses. We attempt to maintain at least one lane of traffic on these roads. Residential streets, secondary roads, and cul-de-sacs are plowed after emergency routes are open.

If possible, we plow from curb to curb. This may take several return trips to your neighborhood depending upon the severity of the snow and because of obstructions on your street. If cars are parked on your street, we will remove as much snow as possible.


**Note:** Our plow trucks do not travel at speeds of more than 20 mph faster speeds create a throwback effect on the windshield. The force of snow being thrown from a plow creates the illusion that the vehicle is moving at a fast rate of speed. As we clean your street; we have no place to push the snow except to the cub line. Be aware that if you clean your driveway, sidewalk, or mailbox before we are finished with your street, it will be plowed back in. This is unavoidable, so please save yourself the aggravation and wait until we have made our final pass.

**SNOW REMOVAL TIP...**if your driveway is cleared before the street is completed, clear an area to the left of the driveway entrance (standing in the driveway, facing the street). When your street is plowed, the snow from the plow can be unloaded in this area instead of your driveway. The more snow you can clear from this area, the less will be deposited at your driveway entrance.

## DO NOT SHOVEL OR SNOW BLOW SNOW INTO THE ROADWAYS...

this practice is illegal under the State Motor Vehicle Code and Borough of Macungie CODE OF ORDINANCE CHAPTER 296 ARTICLE IV. And, it is extremely hazardous. Property owners are also advised that they are responsible for any actions of snow removal services that they hire.

**MOVE YOUR VEHICLES...**to off-street parking whenever possible. Parked cars are a hindrance and hazard to our snow removal efforts.





REMOVE OTHER OBSTRUCTIONS...such as garbage cans, recycling containers, basketball hoops, and trailers.

**SIDEWALKS...**are the responsibility of the property owner. Our ordinance requires that all sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours after the snow has ceased to fall or the ice has formed.

**HANDICAPPED RAMPS...**If you have a handicapped ramp on your sidewalk, you are responsible for maintaining that ramp free of ice and snow, so it is accessible by pedestrians. The same rule applies to handicapped ramps that apply to sidewalks.

**PLEASE HAVE PATIENCE...**Snow removal is a tedious and time-consuming job. Our crews work many hours under very difficult conditions to keep you safe. Travel should be limited during a snowfall and immediately after, unless absolutely necessary. REMEMBER... we are all trying to achieve the same goal of keeping our roadways safe and traffic moving. During snow events SAFETY is paramount, convenience is secondary. Hopefully, we can work together to achieve these goals.
